stone (ston) n.

b. Such concreted matter of a particular type.
Often used in combination.
2. A small piece of rock.
3. Rock or piece of rock shaped or finished
for a particular purpose, especially a piece
of rock that is used in construction.

nexus (nek' sas) n., pl. nexi or nex-us-es.

1. A means of connection; a link or tie.
2. A connected series or group.
3. The core or center.

magazine (mag-uh-zeen), n.

1. A periodical containing a collection of
articles, stories, pictures, or other features
